Jan	25	Top 3 Musical Memories	Share your top three Musical Memories, and tag three friends. Tell us about the first concert you saw, the first time you performed for an audience, or any other experience or memory that was meaningful to you. Tag your friends so they can share their stories too!

Feb	8	Tell us why music matters to you	Post, tweet or record a video message about the importance of music, and why we need music education in our schools. Then, tag a decision maker (ie school board trustee, education minister, MP) to help share the message about the importance of equitable access to quality music education for all Canadian children and youth.
Feb	15	Concert Bloopers	Every concert and performance has a funny "behind the scenes" moment (or sometimes even on stage) that turns an "oops" into an "awww" or just makes your day. Make someone else smile by telling us about it!
Feb	22	If I Could Only Play One Instrument	If you had to choose, what would it be and why? What makes this instrument so special to you? Maybe it's the instrument you learned first, or one you've always dreamed of studying, but never got the chance (yet!)- we want to hear how and why you've connected to your favourite instrument.
March	1	My Best "A-Ha moment"	Sometimes you struggle with a new concept or a new piece of music.  Some days remembering the order of sharps and flats or the LONG list of Italian music terms is just too much for your brain. What or who helped you get over this challenge?
March	8	Make some noise for music education	Let's connect with decision makers, to tell them why we need music in our schools. Write a post about the importance of music education, the impact it has had on your life and/or the lives of your students, children, and friends. Tag the decision makers in your community to share this important message. Now more than ever, music education is essential for students' social emotional learning. Let's work together to make some noise for music education!
