Research



We are the only organization in Canada conducting national research about the status of music education in our schools. Our data provides important information to policy makers, advocates, teachers, administrators and parents. Our 2010 Survey revealed that funds are not keeping up with the demand for music

programs and that a fragile balance of supports is required to keep music education strong in our schools.

Music Monday



Music Monday is our national event that, on the first Monday of each May, provides a powerful way to demonstrate the importance of music education. Since 2005, Music Monday has enabled kids across the country to unite in the celebration of music, highlighting the importance

of music education to the community and the media.
